1. Events

ProCommuns – March 2016



[Procomuns](#) event took place in Barcelona in March 2016 which galvanized the community and pushed the commons collaborative agenda forwards as a follow up to the Floss4P2P event held in 2015. It led to a policy declaration and formation of an international network of commons orientated cities. The P2P Foundation funded the event including location, travel and accommodation, publications and film production. We also produced a video during the event which led to us winning a prestigious award, participated actively in workshops and [disseminated](#) the content of the event widely.

The goals of the event were:

1. Highlight the **relevance of the commons-oriented model within the collaborative economy**, and project internationally the relevance of commons – oriented production in Barcelona and Catalonia.
2. Build **policy recommendations for the public administrations**, specifically to be sent to the Plan of Municipal Action (PAM) for the next 4 years of the Barcelona City Council, and the consultation process of the European Commission, on public policies of promotion and regulation of the collaborative economy and the model of city.
3. Provide **technical guidelines to build free and open software and decentralized technologies for collaborative communities**.

In terms of results, we are happy and proud of the level of creativity and maturity reflected in the **statement of policy recommendations for governments, especially in relation to promote the Commons aspect of collaborative economy. We estimate that we reached 130 proposals!** They are one of the most valuable outputs of the event, as a co-creation process of public policies that now has a document (as a work in progress, version 0.2) which is translated into English (addressed to the European Commission), Catalan (addressed to Barcelona City Council) and Spanish, addressed to other public administrations in Spain or Latin America who want to make use of it.

Peer Value: Advancing the Collaborative Economy – September 2016



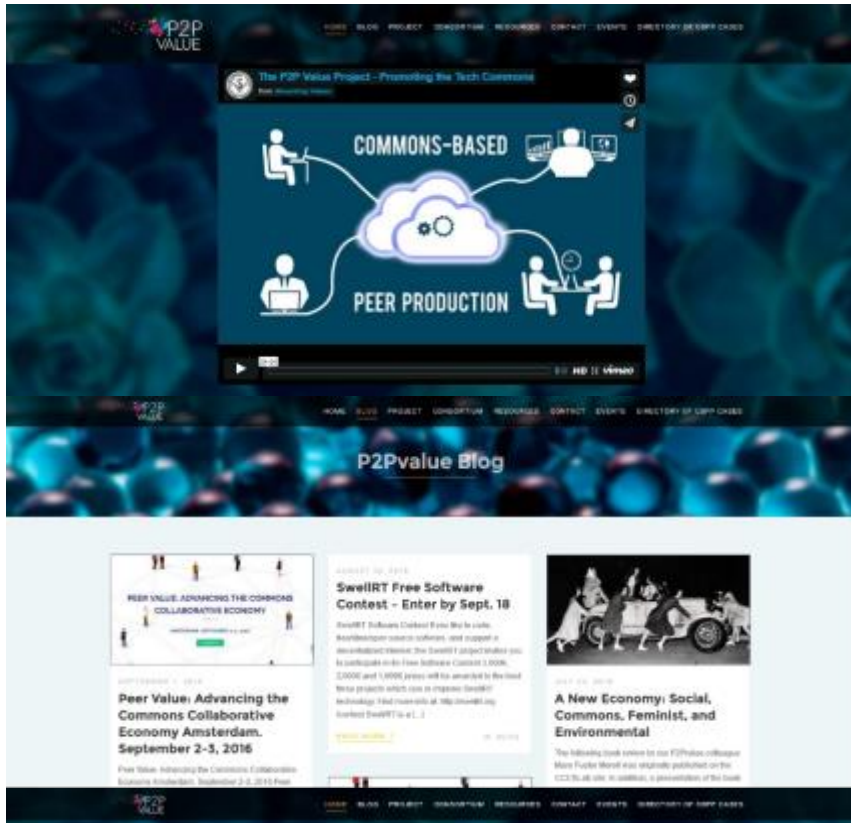
The P2P Foundation hosted a global commons event in Amsterdam city town hall supported by the Amsterdam mayor and CTO. [Peer Value](#) included a collaboration of P2P Value partners and the [Commons Strategies Group](#) explicitly to further the reach of P2P Value beyond the end of the project completion and be a follow up to Procomuns. We invited 30+ speakers, attendance of 150+ people consisting of technology, government, academics and open-source enthusiasts. Focuses included the city as a commons and energy commons as well as presenting Peer Value project to a wider audience. We hosted a meeting of the newly formed commons-orientated cities network started at the Procomuns event in Barcelona in March, 2016. The group formally responded to a recent announcement of the EU's Commons policy. We also organized a [side-event](#) at PakhuisdeZwijger on “the City as a Commons”. [Photos](#) and [videos](#) of the event were made public and released under CC license.

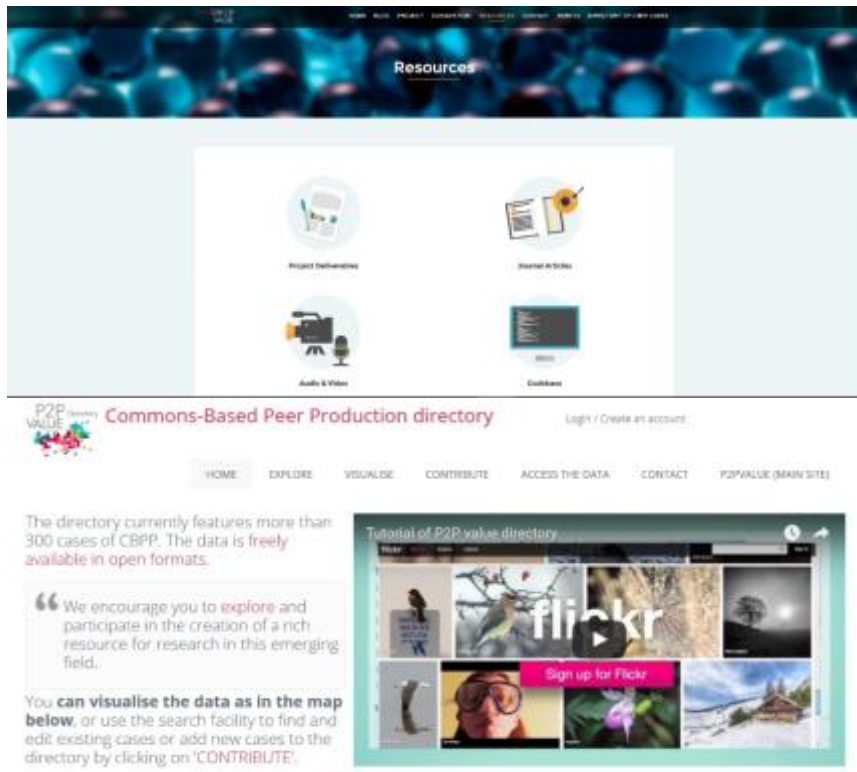
2. Web Archive

In addition, the site has a “Resources” section, containing an archive of documents including project deliverables, journal articles and presentations videos, promotional materials, documentation of events (such as images), and more.
